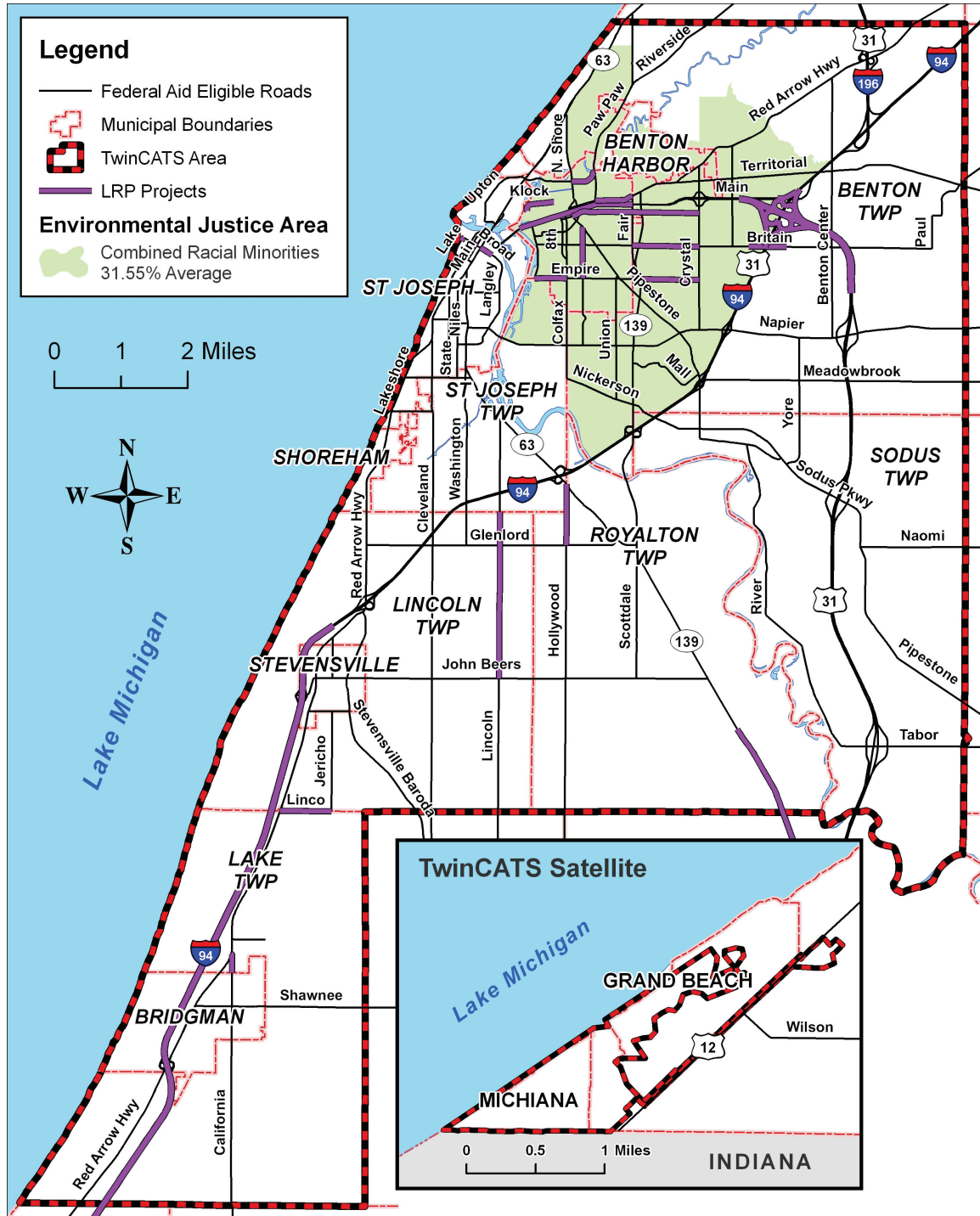
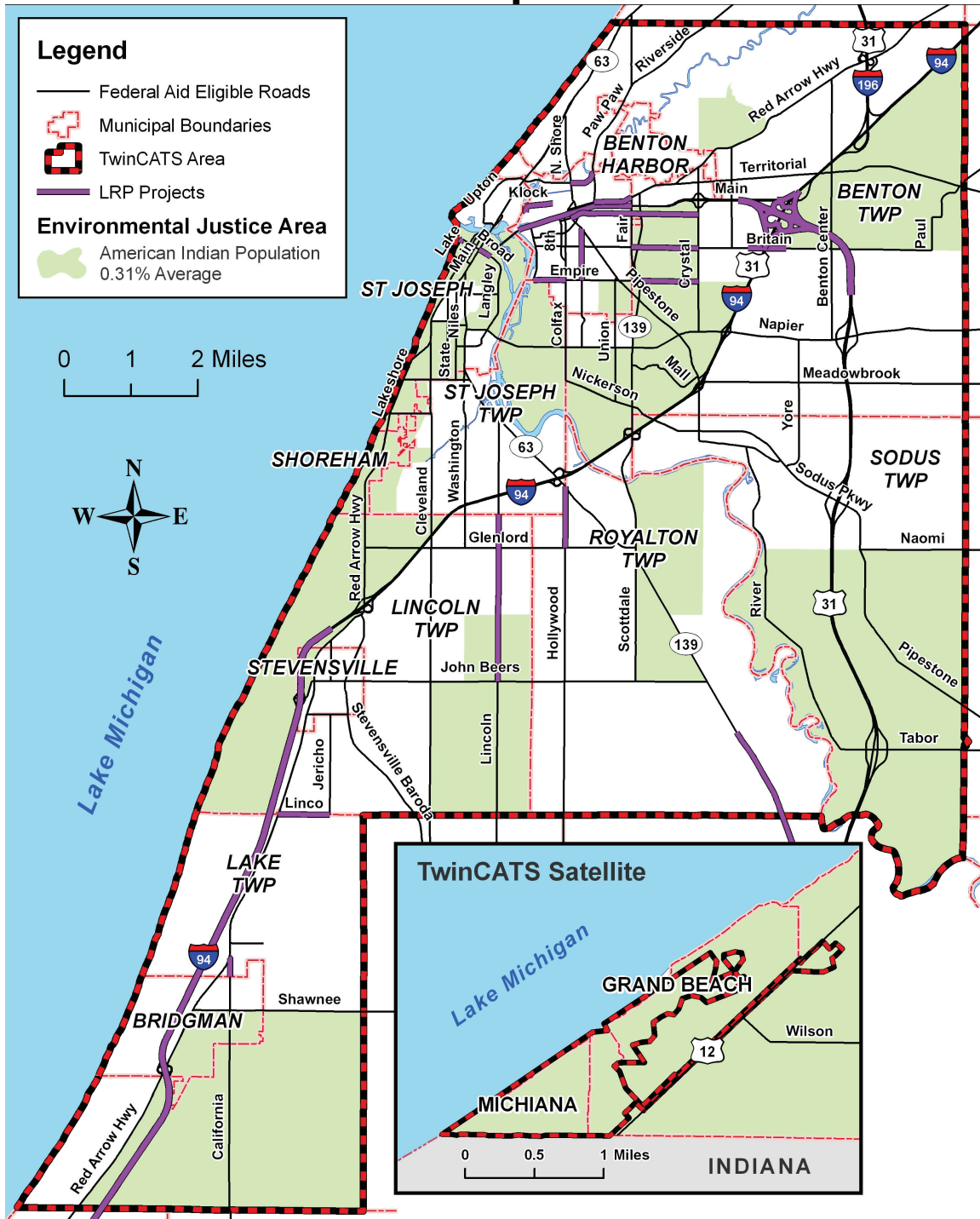

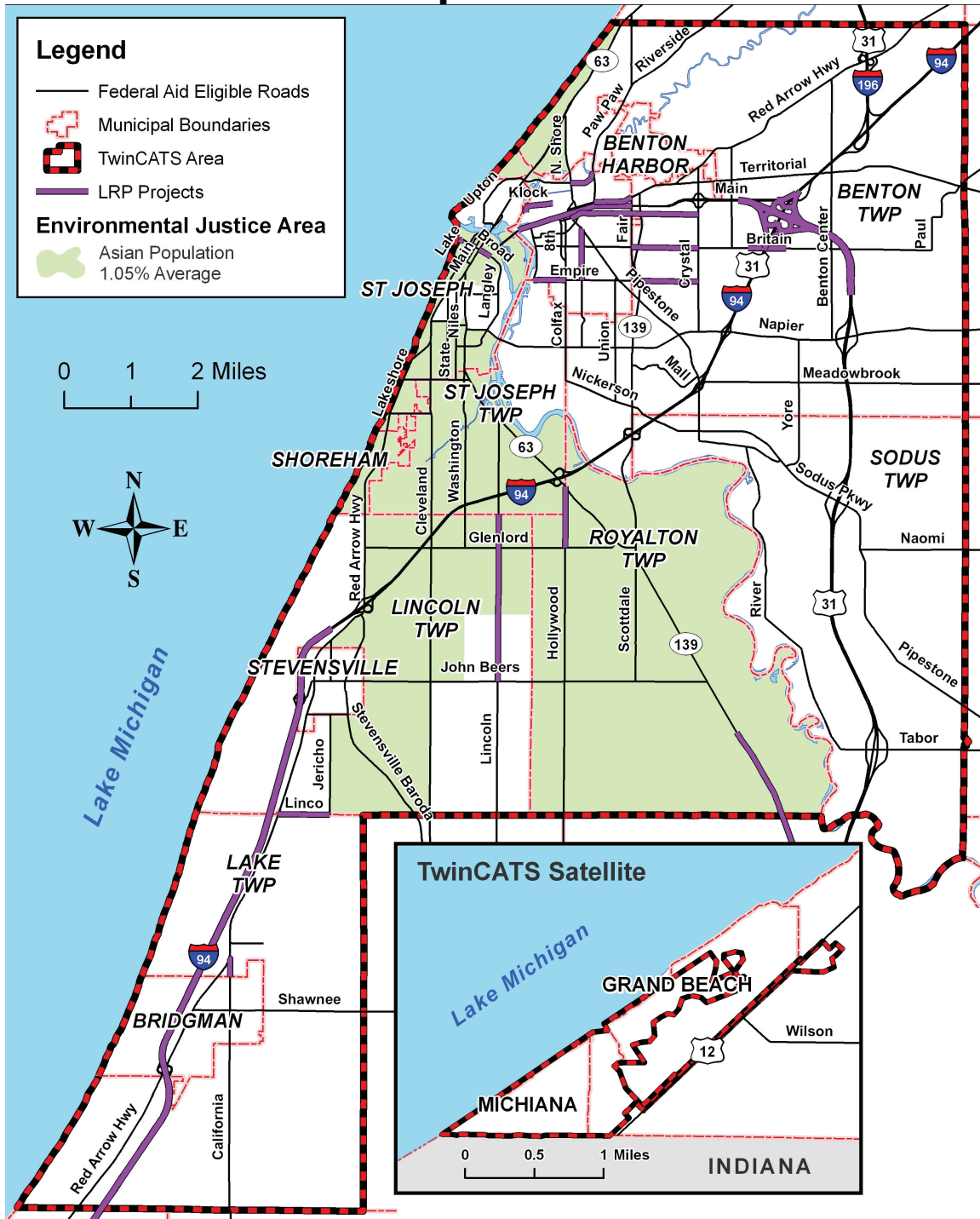
TwinCATS Environmental Justice Combined Racial Minorities



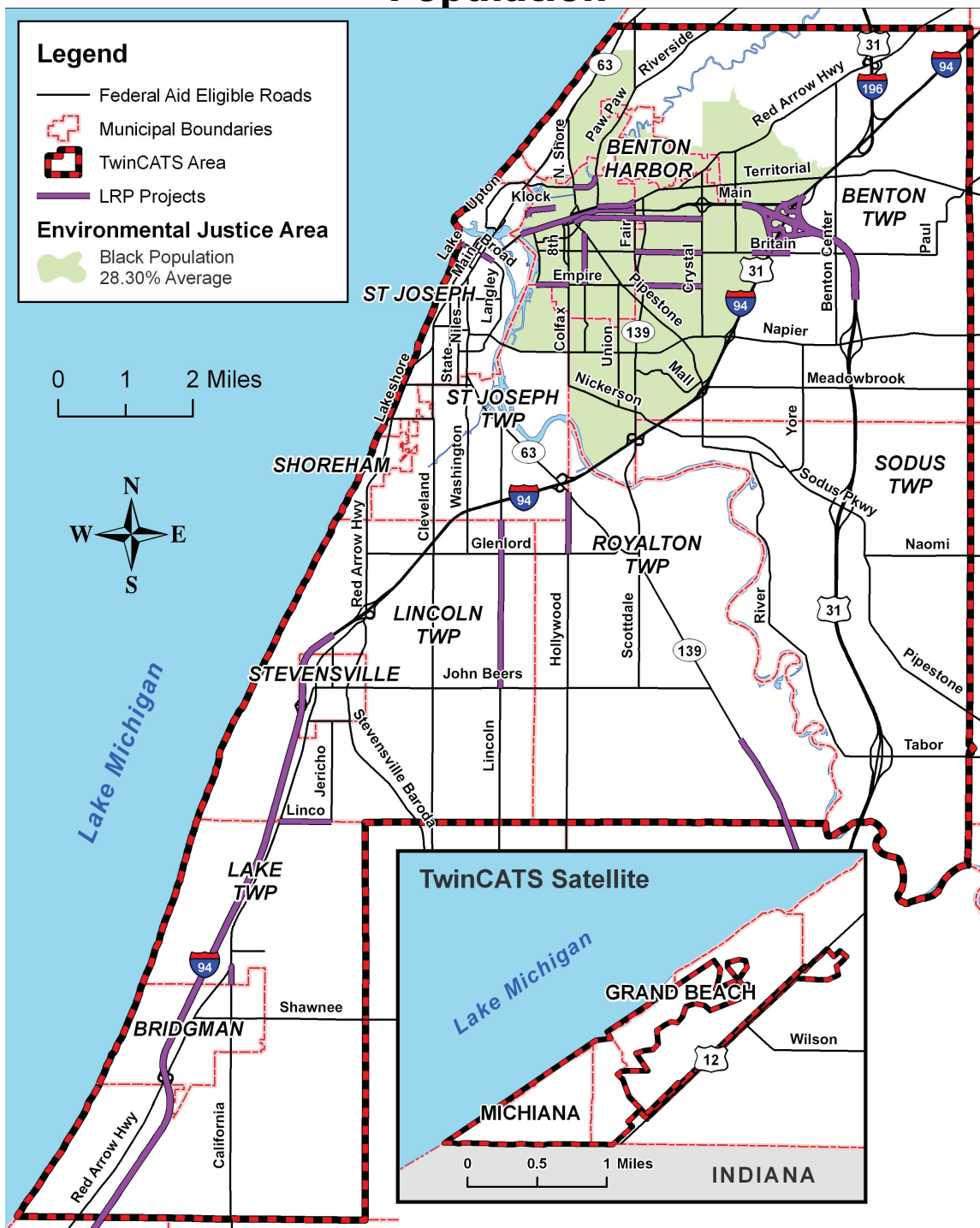
TwinCATS Environmental Justice American Indian Population

Be it Resolved, the Southwest Michigan Planning Commission accepts the results of the eight-hour Ozone Transportation Conformity Analysis for the 2009-2035 Twin Cities Area Transportation Study Long Range Plan and determines that the Plan conforms with the State Implementation Plan.
