## 2013 State of the Region Report

SWMPC is proud to announce the release of the 2013 State of the Southwest Michigan Region Report The 250-page, full-color document represents a culmination of an effort that SWMPC has been undertaking since the initial data sets from the 2010 Census were released. The document presents data from a variety of sources from the last decade related


to Population Vitality, Economic Strength, Personal Prosperity, Community Wellbeing, Lifelong Learning, and Government The Report now compares Southwest Michigan's counties to counties with similar economic bases throughout the United States to assess conditions and performance across many key statistical indicators. The Report is also full of graphics to aid in interpretation of what are often very complex data sets. The aim of this new format for the Report was to create a document that is accessible for all users and serves as a useful measurement tool for regional performance in the future.

The State of the Region Report, and detailed appendix files, are now available at http://www.swmpc.org/2013sotr.asp. Paper copies will also be available very soon.

The data in the document suggests that Southwest Michigan will face a challenge not uncommon throughout the United States: an aging year-round population. At the same time, the population throughout Southwest Michigan is continuing a decades-long trend of moving away from the traditional urban cores. Allowing Southwest Michigan residents to age and thrive in the place that they desire will require new, coordinated strategies for providing services throughout the region, particularly when it comes to healthcare delivery, recreation, transportation, and housing.

It is the hope of SWMPC that residents, businesses, government agencies, and citizen groups are able to use this document to advocate for the changes they wish to see in their communities, and to preserve those factors that already contribute to a high quality of life in our region.

## Michigan's New Water Trail Website!

Water trails are marked routes along rivers, lakes, and coastlines for boating usually intended for quiet water recreation (kayaks and canoes). The trails include: signs and route markers; maps and promotion of water routes; facilities for parking, boat put-in/take-out areas, and places to



picnic and sometimes camp. Water trails can be used for both single day and multiple day trips. An established trail provides safe/legal access to and information about waterways while also providing connections to Michigan's diverse history, ecology, geology, heritage and wildlife.

The State of Michigan has funded the creation of a statewide promotional website to display water trail information and resources. You can view the new website at <a href="www.michiganwatertrails.org">www.michiganwatertrails.org</a>. The Southwest Michigan Planning Commission is partnering with other regional planning agencies around Lake Michigan to plan for a continuous water trail along the coast of Lake Michigan. This is an historic effort to catalyze the various governmental, economic, and cultural institutions that benefit from our globally unique freshwater coastline. Through this project, SWMPC will be actively engaging southwest Michigan coastal communities to make this trail a reality. SWMPC has worked with volunteers to inventory existing public access sites along Lake Michigan and connecting rivers in Berrien, Van Buren and Allegan counties. The next step will be to add amenities to the website that will enhance a paddlers experience on a water trail. These amenities include places to eat, lodging and places to visit such as museums, parks, nature centers, lighthouses and shipwrecks.

## **Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy**

In 2013, the Southwest Michigan Planning Commission (SWMPC) began the process of developing its annual Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy (CEDS) as a function of the U.S. EDA's Partnership Planning grant. Through this process, the 2013 CEDS Strategic Advisory Committee was formed and met at a series of four monthly meetings between August and November 2013 in order to develop the framework of a regional strategy for economic development in southwest Michigan. This team was made up of representatives from local private-sector firms across a range of the region's industry sectors, as well as public sector economic and workforce development professionals, higher education representatives, and state and local government officials. By the end of this strategy development process, a handful of priorities were identified; among these priorities were the need to better align the education-to-workforce pipeline, as well as focusing on talent attraction and retention initiatives.

Although MSHDA is specifically targeting the Cities of Benton Harbor and St. Joseph at this initial event, more Placemaking activities will be provided throughout the region for other localities as the year progresses. This training is one of three programs emerging from SWMPC's new Placemaking Initiative; other programs include a GIS mapping project which will inventory the place-based assets of Berrien, Cass, and Van Buren Counties; as well as a project to cultivate targeted Placemaking projects throughout the region.
