1. Call to Order/ Introductions and Pledge of Allegiance

The Joint Technical Advisory Committee and Policy Committee meeting was called to order by Technical Advisory Committee Chair Joe Bellina at 1:30 PM on February 28, 2017 at the Niles City Council Chambers, 1345 E Main St, Niles, MI.

2. Changes to the Agenda

Brian Berndt had an amendment to add to the agenda

3. Public Comment

None

4. Minutes

Motion to approve the January 24, 2017 Joint Technical Advisory Committee (TAC) & Policy Committee Meeting Minutes, by Brian Berndt, second by Barb Cook. **Motion Approved.**

5. Staff Report

Kim Gallagher explained that the presentation on safety data and technical brief would be postponed Kim went over the performance measures and explained that two measures require VMT history to complete. Currently We only have VMT for the entire South Bend Urbanized area not for the NATS planning area itself. The safety technical brief is expected to be sent out in a week and will be discussed at the March meeting.

Kim then explained a update to the Transportation Alternative Program (TAP) funding. MDOT just explained that the 2014 TAP funding for NATS was still available to spend. In 2014, MDOT reached the obligation authority limit and NATS TAP funding was not obligated. We had thought that this meant that NATS lost out on the money but MDOT explained that NATS has a direct allocation of TAP funding which can't be repurposed and if not spent it carries over to the next year.

Joe Bellina said that he was sending in an application to use the 2017 & 2014 funds for Gumwood Road path phase 3.

Kim explained the process for selecting a TAP project. a call for project went out in October to all committee members (which includes a representative from every jurisdiction within NATS). Applicant then need to fill out MDOT's application and send it to SWMPC. A project review subcommittee will meet to review all the applications and make a recommendation on which project should be chosen. Then the subcommittee will present their recommendation to the TAC & Policy committee for approval. Once approved the project will enter the Transportation Improvement Program and MDOT will proceed with their approval process.

Kim said she would be willing to send out another call for projects.

Motion for SWMPC to resend out a call for projects to use TAP funds made by Craig Bradfield, Second by Sandra Seanor. **Motion Approved**

6. Land Use and Zoning Updates

Sandra Seanor said that Ontwa Township was clarifying language in their master plan.

7. Transit Updates

SWMPC

Kim Gallagher provided an update to the Berrien Countywide Public Transit Service Planning efforts. She reminded the group that the plan to combine the four transit agencies in Berrien County was separate from the service plan SWMPC was coordinating with Nelson Nyygaard. A Steering Committee was created with one member from each system and from the no service area, including: City of Niles, City of Benton Harbor, City of Buchanan, Berrien County, no service area, employment, and finance. Three stakeholder meeting will be held in mid-April followed by public meetings in May

Kim O'Haver said that she submitted her 2018 funding application. She said that she had funds which she thought were ineligible for funding but MDOT said they were. Therefore, she will be presenting an updated budget to be approved during new business.

8. Project Updates

Brian Berndt gave updates on the Berrien county Road Commission projects.

- The Dayton, Orange, Third Fulkerson & Ontario was obligated on January 19th. Construction will be occurring from May to September
- The Redbud trail & Niles Buchanan Road project was obligated on January 19th. Construction will be occurring from May to September

Joe Ray gave an update on the city of Niles project on The Sycamore St. project, it was let on February 3, 2017. Construction will occur from June 19-July 21

Joe Bellina gave an update on Redfield St. The Grade Inspection (GI) and program application was submitted on February 24th.

Denise Smith gave an update on MDOT projects

- Plans were turned in for M-139 on February 19th
- The M-60 project was let. Bids came in 11.2% under the engineer's estimate.

Craig said that Howard township had received a 2018 economic Development grant from MDOT for work on Carberry St. from Lake St. to Yankee St.

9. Old Business

Kim explained that there were minor changes to the UWP amendment letter which was signed at the last NATS meeting. The recipient was changed to Jim Sturdevant. Also the budget code was corrected from state to federal funding.

10. New Business

Kim O'Haver said that she had sent in her application assuming that audit costs were ineligible, but MDOT told her they were eligible and increased the 5311 funding by \$632

The Berrien County Road Commission received a Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP) grant for \$600,000 to upgrade guardrails throughout the county. Since some of this will be used within NATS, Brian Berndt was informed that the funds needed to entered into the NATS TIP. Brian proposed to add the following to the TIP for 2017: \$54,000 in federal HSIP funds, and \$6,000 in local match for a total of \$60,000, to be used on N. Main from Buchanan city limits to Andrews Rd.

Narrative

1. In a brief narrative, describe the proposed work and how the project will benefit the affected community(ies):

The proposed project is Phase 2 of the Ontwa Township Complete Streets program. Phase 1, the Edwardsburg Sport Complex (ESC) Connector Path, ends at Claire Street @ US12. In order to cross at this mid-block crossing, children and residents using this ESC Connector path will have to cross the busy US12 at an unprotected crosswalk.

Claire St @ US12 to the south is the entrance to the Edwardsburg School Corporation housing more than 2,400 students. The proposed project is Phase 2 of the Ontwa Township Complete Streets Program. The proposed project includes a mid-block crosswalk - HAWK Signal, signage and an ADA compliant bike and pedestrian sidewalk as the current sidewalk along US12 to the east to Section Street is only 3 ft. wide. The proposed project will require TAP funding in 2018, 2019,and 2020.

2. Describe how this project is competitive for funding:

The proposed project is important for the school age children that will largely use the Edwardsburg Sports Complex Connector (Phase 1) as well as residents. It is appropriate for the need and user types targeted as it will connect to the school. It connects a Main Street corridor to the school complex and the sports complex. The project also provides non- motorized amenities that increase the usability of the non-motorized facilities in crosswalk ? Hawk signal that will allow for a safer and more accessible mid-block crossing.

The Ontwa Township BOT passed a Complete Streets resolution. Community discussions on bike and pedestrian facilities for various projects including one for Elkhart Rd. were considered. It was determined that the developing a connection to the ESC Connector Path was the most useful project to the community. Letters of support from the Village, Township and Edwardsburg Schools are attached.

The Board of Trustees and Plan Commission received many general letters supporting the construction of bike and pedestrian trails and walkways during discussion about a complete streets policy. Ultimately the Township determined that continuing Phase 1 (Edwardsburg Sport Complex Connector Path) with Phase 2 a HAWK Signal and retrofitting the sidewalks would be most beneficial to the community.

NATS TAP Eligibility Requirements

Gumwood TA Projects 2014-2017

This potential set of projects has been discussed with Matt Wiitala, MDOT TA Grant Coordinator, to make sure the submittal was an appropriate project and fit the MDOT guidelines. Mr. Wiitala felt the proposal had merit, but there might be concerns given the length of time and number of phases to complete the project scope from the Indiana state line to the Milton Township complex. He suggested looking into additional statewide TA Grants in out years to supplement the local TA system amounts to move the project forward.

Several NATS Long Range Plan goals are a fit with this project:

Enhance Economic Vitality of Southwest Michigan

This project will serve to enhance the economic vitality of Southwest Michigan by providing a multi-modal transportation link between the growing community of Milton Township with the commercial shopping complexes located in Indiana. This connection can provide alternate transportation to individuals who live and work in these areas.

<u>Produce a Regional Transportation System that Connects People with Their Destinations</u> This project will allow a direct path for travel between the developments planned along Gumwood Road between the Indiana state line and Redfield Street with the Milton Township Hall and the commercial complexes in Indiana. The Milton Township hall provides the local government function, including public meetings and voting; the Township Hall site is also being developed to include athletic and park facilities for the community.

<u>Provide an Environment that Promotes Livable Communities and Environmental Responsibility</u> With the rising costs of transportation the Milton Township area is seeing an increase in the use of non-motorized traffic. Milton Township and the Cass County Road Commission recognize the need to develop safe non-motorized alternatives of travel. Providing a pathway that connects to pathways in Indiana and connecting to points in Milton Township will allow for non-vehicular use that does not contribute to increased air pollution contributed by motorized vehicles. This will provide an environmental air quality benefit as well as individual health and economic benefits.


Produce a Safe Transportation System

The multi-use path will be a non-adjacent pathway, reducing the conflicts between motorized and non-motorized traffic along the Gumwood Road corridor.

The project fits in with Milton Township plans to improve multi-modal transportation alternatives within the township as it continues to grow and develop.

At this time the community is not planning on contributing more than minimum local match required.

Due to limited TA and local funding this is a phased project.
