2045 Long Range Plan

Gallagher gave a brief overview of the 2045 Long Range Planning Process. Information included overview of MPO role in planning process and elements of Long Range Plan. See attached.

Roseann Marchetti reported that the Village of Cassopolis had applied for a Sustainably Built Environmental Project through Michigan State University. Richard Cooper reported that the Niles Charter Comprehensive Plan draft is now online. Sandra Seanor also noted that the Ontwa Township Master Plan and Zoning plan is also online for review.

Connect Berrien Update:

Kim Gallagher explained that a new project manager (Paul Jewel/CEO) from Nelson Nygaard is now in place for the Connect Berrien Countywide Public Transit Service planning effort. She further explained that several conference calls had taken place between SWMCP staff and Nelson Nygaard to discuss next steps to get the project back on track and to schedule the next Steering Committee meeting which will take place September 27, 2017 at the SWMPC office with Nelson Nygaard.

Evan Smith informed the committee that Niles DAR and Buchanan DAR were participating in a statewide call discussing potential for a coordinated statewide reduced fare card for people with disabilities and seniors.

- Yankee Street in Howard Township ROW acquisition phase with MDOT and property owners and Cass County Drain Commissioner.
- Carberry Road local match is being provided by Howard Township.
- Do CDBG projects need to be included in TIP?

Approval of 2045 Socioeconomic and Employment Data

Committee needs to approve the data as presented which represents a reasonable projection for population and employment in the year 2045.

Jon Roberts, MDOT Modeling Section reviewed Future Year Socioeconomic Data that included total population, group quarters, occupied dwelling units, farm employment, basic employment, retail employment, service employment and total employment. Gallagher reminded the committee that this data was previously distributed to the committee in paper form and electronically.

Motion by the Policy Committee to approve the data as presented which represents a reasonable projection for population and employment in the year 2045, by Serita Mason. Second by Craig Bradfield. **Motion Approved.**

State and Federal Updates

Jim Sturdevant announced that all MDOT and local projects were obligated for 2017. He also announced that Don Mayle will be taking over the statewide Rural Task Force Program and Jim along with another MDOT staff member will be providing assistance in the Rural Task Force Program. Jason Latham announced that the state of Michigan is in the process of updating the State of Michigan Long Range Plan and for the first time ever will be contracting with a consultant to perform the work.

11. Privilege of the Floor

High Speed Rail: Don Ryman once again expressed support for High Speed Rail and asked what was being done with it. He further explained that the City of Niles is very interested and could help reduce greenhouse gas.

US 12: Don Ryman noted that mailboxes are on both sides of the road along US 12. Suggested that state of Michigan could put our recommendations to landowners to improve safety when crossing street to retrieve mail.

Homeless in ROW: Richard Copper asked what can be done to address complaints from citizens regarding homeless living under bridges by St. Joseph River. Jason Latham, MDOT informed the committee that people need to have a permit to place things within the ROW. Jason, Pete Pilfer-MDOT and Berrien County Sheriff Bailey will work together to discuss issue.

2045 Long Range Plan

Quick Overview

- ■MPO is an organization created by the Federal government to help ensure the smart and effective investment of limited public transportation dollars.
- ■Any urban area with more than \$50,000 must have an MPO
- ■443 MPO's nationwide and 15 in Michigan
- •MPO's are responsible for conducting the transportation planning process for the urban area

What is a Long Range Plan

The LRP is required by Federal law for the MPO to receive funding for transportation projects

Updated every five years

Has a minimum 20 year planning horizon

Is multi-model (Highway, transit, bike/Pedestrian and freight

What is a Long Range Plan

The long range transportation plan:

- Assistance from the Federal government
- Administered by the state
- Locally driven by the MPO

∘ June 2018: NATS Approval

∘ July 2018: SWMPC Approval
