- CSS policies, flexible design standards
- LRTP/ TIP policies and priorities
- TIP project selection criteria
- NEPA/project development
- Targeted funding for transportation projects
- Priority investment areas
- Fiscal incentives for certain types of development
- Local comprehensive plans
- Subarea plans
- Zoning ordinances and subdivision regulations
- Development review and permitting
- Access permitting

Implementation Tools (continued)

- Concurrency/adequate public facilities ordinances
- Transfer of development rights
- Purchase of development rights
- Education and outreach
- Development design guidelines/manuals
- Technical assistance with standards and code revision
- State codes
- Joint development
- Redevelopment authority
- Implementation team
- Interagency partnerships and agreements

Implementation Plan Requirements
