Regional Clearinghouse Review

In 1982, the U.S. Congress mandated that a process to review grant applications should be coordinated through existing State organizations whenever possible. In Michigan, regional planning organizations were assigned this task. The Southeast Michigan Council of Governments is designated as the clearinghouse for projects of statewide interest and the other planning regions respond to applications of less than statewide significance in their local areas. SWMPC serves as the clearinghouse for projects in Berrien, Cass, and Van Buren Counties. Currently most federal agencies require all applicants, government non-profits and private citizens, to submit to the same process. This requirement is now also part of some state agency grant processes.

SPOC at SWMPC

- 1. Requests for clearinghouse review are received by mail, fax, or email.
- 2. File number assigned and confirmation sent
- 3. Informational letter sent to appropriate interested parties
- 4. Collected comments and questions are sent to the applicant and Grantor
- 5. The SWMPC Full Board or Administration Committee "clear" projects

The clearinghouse process disseminates information about potential grants as widely as possible through a "Single Point of Contact" (SPOC) system. By submitting a copy of the standard grant cover from (SF 424) and a summary of the goals and scope of the proposed project to the appropriate regional planning agency, an applicant has the opportunity to notify concerned parties. The applicant's contact information and project summary are made available for further inquiry to neighboring communities and related agencies by the regional clearinghouse which collects comments and questions.

The planning regions conducting these reviews do not have any authority to approve or deny funds as part of the process. Only the grantors select the awards. The clearinghouse process is intended to promote coordination of effort. If you have further questions about the SPOC system, contact Terri Moore at mooret@swmpc.org or (269) 925-1137 x 20.



Michigan Association of Regions

The Michigan Association of Regions (MAR) is a statewide group comprised of 14 planning and development regions. MAR consists of a policy board of local elected and appointed officials that meets periodically to discuss regional policy issues and programs, and adopts legislative positions. The Executive Director's group carries out MAR's mission:

- To provide a strong, unified voice for all regions in communicating their positions to state and federal agencies on issues of common concern
- To provide a network for the sharing of information and mutual support among the regions
- To ensure equitable treatment from state and federal agencies for the regions based on local needs and concerns
