1. Call to Order and Roll Call

Policy Committee Chair, Dick Stauffer, Called the meeting to order at 9:30 am. Kim Gallagher took roll call.

2. Changes to the Agenda

None.

3. Public Comment

None.

4. Approval of November 24, 2020 TwinCATS Meeting Minutes

Motion to approve the minutes from the November 24, 2020 combined Technical Advisory and Policy Committee meeting. Made by Jonathon Fisk and seconded by Cathy Yates. **Motion approved.**

5. **SWMPC Staff Report**

Gallagher presented on the Fiscal Year 2020 list of obligated projects. The list shows all of the federal surface transportation funds programed for the TwinCATS area. In 2020, the federal government programed over \$47 million for the TwinCATS area of which the vast majority, at \$42 million, was for the US-31 extension.

6. Agency & Project Updates

a) **Twin Cities Area Transportation Authority:** Gillespie said that the 45 TCATA employees are in the 1b group for the COVID-19 vaccine. TCATA just signed a new union contract, which was last negotiated in 2017. The new contract gives drivers a raise and eliminates the wage difference between full-time and part-time drivers.

Gillespie said that the repair of the TCATA headquarters driveway was complete. The next project is to install security cameras for the property. He said he is still working on the TCATA safety plan.

b) Local Agencies

Berrien County Road Department: Stack said that Washington Avenue was in design, with environmental (NEPA) submitted. The Napier Bridge is being finalized with a cost that came in slightly higher than programed. The work will include beam repair, deck rehab, and new lighting.

City of St. Joseph: Zebell said that the Langley Avenue project had bids come in last Friday at 11% lower than estimated.

Napier Avenue: Stack discussed the use of a road fabric to extend the roadway lifespan. The technique is not new but Napier is the first use by the Berrien County Road Department. He said that this process is for roads with a concrete base and an asphalt surface. In Berrien County, this is mainly heavily traveled roads such as Red Arrow and Pipestone. Jonathon Smith added that MDOT had used the road fabric before with success.

Denise Cook said that design for the Napier sidewalk was underway with Wightman & Associates as the engineering contractor. The preferred design is to do six foot sidewalks on both sides of Napier. The project will require some easements and utility relocation.

c) **MDOT:** Smith said that tree clearing would begin thin month for the M-139 culvert over Buckhorn creek. The culvert replacement would be in July require a detour.

Lipset gave an update on the current progress of US-31. Most work will pause for the winter and restart in April. Lipset presented an online GIS storyboard for the US-31 project. The tool is an interactive map that will give information about the history of the project, show the current progress, and identify the detour routes.

Lipset gave an update on the Michigan toll road study. She said a consultant was chosen. She is working on traffic models to see how tolls may affect travel. She added that the reduction in travel due to COVID-19 may affect this. They are now beginning to explore potential corridors to study. She added that the study is still in the very early stages.

7. New Business

a) Pavement and Bridge Performance Targets: Kovnat presented on the pavement and bridge performance measures. He showed the pavement and bridge history and how targets were selected. Stack added that Berrien County Road Department has a bridge asset management plan and has been able to get projects funded quickly for bridges in poor condition.

Motion for the Technical Advisory Committee to recommend that the policy committee adopt and support the state's pavement and bridge performance targets. Made by Tim Zebell and seconded by Tim Kading. **Motion approved**.

Motion for the Policy committee to approve the recommendation from the Technical Advisory Committee. Motion made by Jim Sturdevant, seconded by Eric Lester. **Motion approved**.

- b) **Berrien County Road Department Guardrail Project:** Stack said that he had nothing to add beyond what was in the packet.
- c) **MDOT Preventative Maintenance**: Kovnat said the overall project was preventative maintenance within the seven county MDOT southwest region. Within TwinCATS, the project is crack sealing along M-139.

Motion for the Technical Advisory Committee to recommend that the policy committee approve the amendments to the 2020-2023 Transportation Improvement Program. Made by Tim Kading and seconded by Terrie Smith. **Motion approved**.

Motion for the Policy committee to approve the recommendation from the Technical Advisory Committee. Motion made by John Hodgson Lester, seconded by Denise Cook. **Motion approved**.


Staff Report

2022 Unified Work Program

- SWMPC staff participated in a meeting with MDOT to discuss the 2022 Unified Work Plan that outlines work SWMPC staff will focus on in 2022. (March 6th)
- The plan also includes emphasis areas from FHWA and FTA.
- The primary focus for the 2022 UWP will be the 2023-2026 Transportation Improvement Plan.
- SWMPC staff will be bringing the draft 2022 UWP forward to the TwinCATS members at the May meeting.

2021 PASER Rating —Pavement Condition Evaluation

- SWMPC is charged with conducting PASER ratings on federal aid eligible roads on an annual basis in Berrien, Cass and Van Buren Counties.
- One half of the network is evaluated on an annual basis by trained and certified members of a 3 person team – MPO, MDOT, County Road Agency.
- No Ratings occurred in 2020 because of pandemic
- Transportation Asset Management Council has requested that 100 % of the federal aid network in Berrien, Cass and Van Buren Counties is rated in 2021.
- Local non-federal road PASER evaluation requests are being taken by SWMPC for 2021. There is no guarantee they will be completed because of increased workload and reduced number of raters on team.



2023 Call for Safety Projects – Statewide

Highway Safety Improvement program

Purpose: Provide funding to reduce crashes with an emphasis on reducing fatalities and serious injuries

Who Can Apply & where can the funds be used: Any road agency on any public road.

How Much is available: \$600,000 maximum per project. Projects that address a K/A crash require a 10% local match. Maximum of \$2 million per agency

Selection Process: Statewide competitive, based on a cost-benefit analysis.

Application Deadline: May 1, 2021



2022 TEDF Category B

Villages and Small Cities

Purpose: Provide funding for road repairs on any public road. Encouraging application for roads not eligible federal aid or other TEDF grants (i.e. not an all season route)

Who Can Apply: Any Village or city with a population of 10,000 or less based on the 2010 U.S. Census - St. Joseph, Shoreham, Stevensville, Bridgman (TwinCATS Area Jurisdictions)

How Much: Max award of \$250,000 with a 50% local match




