### 1. Call to Order and Roll Call

Policy Committee Chair, Dick Stauffer, Called the meeting to order at 9:30 am. Kim Gallagher took roll call.

2. Changes to the Agenda

3. Public Comment

None.

#### 4. Approve Minutes from February 10, 2020 Meeting

The minutes from the February meeting has a spelling typo in Item 7 on who made the motion to approve the MDOT amendments.

**Motion** to approve the minutes from the January 13, 2020 combined Technical Advisory and Policy Committee meeting. Made by Dick Stauffer and seconded by Terrie Smith. **Motion approved.** 

#### 5. <u>SWMPC Staff Report</u>

Gallagher reminded the committees about the MDOT 2022 call for safety projects. Gallagher said that Kovnat was available to do safety analysis for any agency by request.

Gallagher gave an update about the current census response rate for TwinCATS member communities which can be found at <u>https://www.censushardtocountmaps2020.us/</u>

#### 6. Agency & Project Updates

Agency updates are included in the meeting packet/power point

**Twin Cities Area Transportation Authority (TCATA)**: Gallagher highlighted that TCATA was going to receive \$2.3 million from the CARES Act. This funding is 100% federal and requires no local match.

**Local Road Agencies**: Chris Cook raised the issue that if projects are delayed now, this might lead to contractor capacity issues once work begins, and that every project that was planned for this summer may not be able to be completed

**MDOT**: Sanada commented on the work delays thorough April 20. He said that contractors are ready to work, but they are waiting to secure Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) before they begin work.

Smith said that the I-94BL repaving was to begin on April 20, which was the tentative date.

Boughner said that due to less driving there was a drop in revenue from the gas tax. She said that MDOT is not changing any projects at this time. They are, however, prioritizing the projects funded with the Rebuilding Michigan Bond program in case changes need to be made later.

#### 7. <u>New Business</u>

**Amendments to the Transportation Improvement Program (TIP):** Kovnat briefly described the proposed amendments to the TIP, which are fully described in the meeting packet/power point.

Chris Cook asked why the Roosevelt Road Path project was not obligated in 2019 as planned. Stauffer answered that the bridge over Hickory Creek needed a redesign due to feedback from the Department of Environment, Great Lakes, and Energy (EGLE). By the time the redesign was complete, the state had already spent all of its 2019 road funding (known as obligation authority). Kovnat added that in 2019, obligation authority ran out earlier than usual. Many projects throughout the state that required EGLE or State Historic Preservation Office (SHPO) clearance were not obligated that year.

Chris Cook said that he is still having issues with getting SHPO clearance and that this is holding up several projects.

Sturdevant said that SHPO has been having staffing shortages, which is now amplified by COVID-19.

Clarke said that the additional carpool lot location was discussed at a previous TwinCATS meeting [a budget increase for this project was voted on in October 2019, but the additional location was not included in that vote. This amendment would add the additional carpool lot and another budget change].

**Motion** for the Technical Advisory Committee to recommend that the Policy Committee approve the amendments to the TwinCATS 2020-2023 Transportation Improvement Program as contained in the meeting packet. Made by Terrie Smith and seconded by Chris Cook. **Motion approved**.

**Motion** for the Policy committee to approve the recommendation from the Technical Advisory Committee. Made by Denise Cook and seconded by Jim Sturdevant. **Motion approved.** 

**Twin CATS 2020 Unified Work Program (UWP) Budget Amendment:** Gallagher briefly described the budget revision to the TwinCATS 2020 UWP.

**Motion** for the Technical Advisory Committee to recommend that the Policy Committee approve the budget revision for the fiscal year 2020 Unified Work Program as contained in the meeting packet. Made by Jim Sturdevant and seconded by Chris Cook. **Motion approved**.

**Motion** for the Policy committee to approve the recommendation from the Technical Advisory Committee. Made by Denise Cook and seconded by Jim Sturdevant. **Motion approved.** 

#### 8. Privilege of the Floor or Public Comment

Fisk asked why a two month delay in the letting of US-31 would lead to a full year delay in the open to traffic date.

Lipset answered that the US-31 project is a design-build, which requires more complexity. MDOT wanted to allow contractors more time to refine their proposals. She said that this would mean major work could not begin this summer. However, the inability to complete tree cutting this past winter is not causing any additional delay. Lipset also said that the new proposed "open to traffic" date may not be the actual date that the project is complete, but was chosen to give the contractors more leeway. She said that there is other work on I-94 scheduled for 2023, which would potentially mean that multiple major construction projects would be undertaken along I-94 at the same time.

#### 9. Adjournment

The meeting was adjourned at 10:22 AM. The next meeting is scheduled for May 18, 2020 at 9:30 AM to be conducted by conference call.







### FY 2021 Unified Work Program

October 1, 2020 – September 30, 2021

- The Unified Work Program is a annually approved document describing the work tasks for the TwinCATS staff in FY 2021
- Budget for planning activities
- Reflects the required work activities the MPO must undertake under federal regulations as well as local priorities for the TwinCATS Area.

## FY 2020 Unified Work Program

### **Work Elements**

**Program Administration**: Covers all of the administration and other supporting tasks that are required to ensure efficient operation of the TwinCATS MPO.

**Data Collection, Analysis, and Reporting**: The gathering of transportation related data including the traffic count program. It also includes most mapping and GIS related tasks as well as any work related to the analysis, display, or reporting of data.

**Transportation Planning**: Includes technical assistance to members, public outreach, the administration of special plans, and updating the Long Range Plan.

**Transportation Improvement Program (TIP**): The TIP is a listing of all federal or state funded transportation projects in the TwinCATS planning area. The TIP work category covers project selection, TIP development, monitoring project status, and processing amendments.
