1. Call to Order / Introductions and Pledge of Allegiance

Technical Advisory chair Joe Bellina called the meeting to order at 1:30 PM and led the group in introductions. Joe Ray led the Pledge of Allegiance.

2. Changes to the Agenda

None

3. Public Comment

None.

4. Approve Minutes

Kelly Gettman-Dissette said there were a few minor typos.

Motion to approve the minutes from the June 25, 2019 joint Technical Advisory Committee and Policy Committee meeting with typos corrected. Made by Dawn Bolock, seconded by Roseann Marchetti. **Motion approved.**

5. **Staff Report**

Kim Gallagher said that committee members had expressed interest in receiving education. This will provide value to meetings and help members better understand the MPO process. A survey will be sent to committee members in order to gauge which topics are of greatest interest.

Gallagher added that the best place to begin learning about NATS is in the Committee member handbook. If a member does not have a handbook, they can email Brandon Kovnat (kovnatb@swmpc.org) to receive one. A digital copy is being made as well.

Kovnat presented the meeting and amendment schedule for Fiscal Year 2020. He explained that all amendments need to be sent to him by the Friday four weeks prior to the meeting.

Kovnat also mentioned that SWMPC, MDOT, and the county road departments have recently completed their annual joint rating of pavement condition on federal aid roads using the PASER system. A report including more information on this process and a summary of the pavement conditions in the NATS area will be published in September.

6. Community Land Use and Zoning Member Updates

Kevin Stack said an AEP service center is being built on Walton road in Buchanan Township.

Joe Ray said that construction was is about to begin on a natural gas power plant in the city of Niles. The plant will create 500-750 construction jobs and about 20 permanent employees.

Lynn Ferris said that Buchanan Township is building a new township hall behind the existing hall, which will be bulldozed.

Bill Kasprzak said that several farmers are looking into building commercial solar facilities on their property.

7. Public Transit Updates

- a) **Niles Dial A Ride**: Gettman-Dissette mentioned that Niles Dial A Ride received a plaque at the Michigan Public Transportation Association conference for their 45 years of service.
- b) Buchanan Dial A Ride: None.

8. Road Project Updates

Berrien County Road Department project updates presented by Kevin Stack.

- a) North Main Street Buchanan Township: Construction of the two inch overlay is complete.
- b) **Bertrand Road Bertrand Township**: Construction of a two inch overlay is approximately halfway complete. The project includes widening to add a 3 ft. shoulder.

Cass County Road Commission project updates presented by Joe Bellina.

- a) **Redfield Road Conrad to M-62:** The project was bid in early august and will be complete by the end of September.
- b) Redfield Tree Removal on Fir to Brush: The final plans were recently submitted. Letting is expected in January. Indiana bats may be present in the area. The Indiana Bat nesting season occurs April thru October, therefore, tree removal must avoid these times as to not impair the bat population. Cutting will occur in March and, if not completed in March, finished in November 2020.

MDOT updates presented by Jonathon Smith

a) **M-51:** project is currently on hold due to the strike at Reith-Riley – the construction firm hired to work on the project.

9. Old Business

None.

10. New Business

Gallagher presented an amendment to the Fiscal year 2020 Unified Work program (UWP) (see attached). She explained that MDOT had awarded NATS an additional \$25,000 in federal funds to work on the SWMPC website and for staff to assist communities with implementing multi-modal transportation plans.

The amendment to the UWP includes the following items:

- 1) A change to the planning budget by adding an additional \$25,000 in federal funds and \$5,554 in local match (page 9).
- 2) A recalculation of the share of local match based on the revised planning budget (Page 10).
- 3) Descriptions for the two additional work items (Page 39 & 40).

Clarification was requested on whether the vote to amend the UWP was a vote on behalf of the member jurisdictions to pay their share of the local match. There was also a question about whether the local match (page 10) was an additional match above the amount already voted on when the UWP was approved in May.

Gallagher explained that the "revised local match" on page 10 refers to the total amount each community will be invoiced for by SWMPC in January 2020.

Motion for the Technical Advisory Committee to recommend that the Policy Committee approve the amendment to the NATS Fiscal Year 2020 Unified Work Program as presented. Made by Kevin Stack, seconded by Susan Flowers. **Motion approved**.

Motion for the Policy Committee to approve the Technical Advisory Committee's recommendation. Made by Sandra Seanor, seconded by Eric Lester. **Motion approved.**

11. State And Federal Updates

Jim Sturdevant said that the NATS 2045 Long Range plan received its approval from EPA and FHWA. He is now working on getting the 2020-2023 TIP approved.

Anita Boughtner mentioned that MDOT Statewide Planning Section has five vacant positions.

12. Privilege of the floor

Bellina said that there was a sinkhole forming on US-12 east of Gumwood Rd. in Milton Township. In the upcoming weeks, MDOT will close the road for repairs.

Gallagher said that at the MPTA conference there was a presentation on the Volkswagen Settlement, in which the company has to pay restitution for cheating on the emission tests for their diesel vehicles. Gallagher said that the funds could be used to replace diesel buses from 2009 or earlier. School districts are eligible recipients.

13. Adjournment

The meeting was adjourned at 2:30 PM. the next NATS meeting is scheduled for September 24, 2019 at 1:30 PM


