A HOMEOWNER'S GUIDE TO PROTECT OUR WATER AND BEACHES

WHY SHOULD I CARE ABOUT MAINTAINING MY SYSTEM?

- Without regular maintenance, a septic system will fail.
(It's the homeowners' responsibility to maintain the system!)
- Save money and protect your investment in your home.
(It only costs about \$250 every 3 years to maintain your system, while a new system could cost thousands!)
- Protect your drinking water and the environment.
(A properly working septic will remove pollutants and disease-causing bacteria and viruses (such as E. coli).)

HOW CAN I PROPERLY MAINTAIN MY SYSTEM?

- The average septic system should be inspected at least every three years by a professional.
- Limit excessive water usage in your home.
- Protect your home's drinking water for you and your family - NEVER flush hazardous materials into the system!
- Expensive additives are not necessary and they do NOT eliminate the need for pumping!

Can I spot potential problems in my septic system?

Yes! If you see...

1. Plumbing backups
2. Sluggish Drainage
3. Mushy ground or ponding water around the drainfield

DO

- Learn the location of your septic tank and drainfield from your septic company
- Have your septic system inspected every three years
- Call a professional whenever you experience problems
- Keep a detailed record of repairs
- Conserve water to avoid overloading the system
- Divert sources of water, like roof drains, house footing drains, and sump pumps away from the septic system



DON'T

- EVER go down into a septic tank - toxic gases in the tank can kill in minutes
- Allow anyone to park or drive over the system
- Plant anything besides grass over or near the drainfield
- Dig in your drainfield or build anything over it
- Make or allow repairs without obtaining the required health department permit
- Allow backwash from home water softeners to enter the septic system
